Each year group at Notre Dame Catholic Sixth Form College has a clear and stable Careers Programme tailored to meet their needs. This Careers Programme is embedded into tutorials, assemblies, subject curriculum, and enrichment activities, providing a variety of compulsory and optional events throughout the academic year. Students can access careers support from Monday to Friday either face to face or via email, and can book their own appointments using Moodle Careers.
