

Tim Marshall Prisoners of Geography Hans Rosling Factfulness







4. A summer learning activity/task

To carry out research into a country from each continent (of course excluding Antarctica).

As a Geographer you need a sound understanding of the world in which you live, the characteristics of different countries and continents but also how they interact with each other. To help you start thinking, we would like you to produce a fact file for each country given below; each country is one that you will study as part of the course and so this information will be of use. The work can be presented as a word document, PowerPoint or hand written but needs to include a wide variety of sources of information (maps, photos) and must show selective use of information – this is not a cut and paste exercise.

Research the following information:

Physical Geography – location, topography, rivers, coastlines, hazards, climate **Human Geography** – Economic, social, cultural, history, look for data that show their level of development – wealth, health, education etc.
