12 Angry Men (U)

Story line: A jury deliberates behind closed doors on the fate of someone accused of murder. One lone dissenter within the jury (played by Henry Fonda) pleads a compelling case to convince the other eleven jurors that this is not a clear-cut case, unveiling and challenging prejudices and preconceptions as they arise in the debate.

The Stanford Prison Experiment (15)

Story line: A film adaptation of a psychological experiment by Phillip Zimbardo into societal roles. Zimbardo assigns college students in America the role of either a prisoner or prison guard and places them in a mock prison to simply watch how they behave. What do you think will happen? What would you do in this situation?



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Bowling for Columbine (15)

Story line: Bowling for Columbine is a 2002 American documentary film written, produced, directed, and narrated by Michael Moore. The film explores what Moore suggests are the primary causes for the Columbine High School massacre in 1999 and other acts of violence with guns. Moore focuses on the background and environment in which the massacre took place and some common public opinions and assumptions about related issues. The film also looks into the nature of violence in the United States. What are your opinions on why people partake in these acts of violence?
